

WARNING

This guide must be carefully read by all persons who have or will have the responsibility for using or maintaining the AirFrame[™] helmet and its additional accessories. This system will perform as designed only if used and maintained according to these instructions.



Note: Screws and anchors A and B are identical; screw and anchor C is different.

1. Remove screws and anchors A, B, and C from helmet. Both helmet strap ends will detach from the helmet. Be sure to only work on one side of the helmet at a time in order to simplify installation (left side shown).

The AirFrame™ Ear and Chop accessories are designed to be used in conjunction with Rails (sold separately).



2. Turn helmet over to view interior. If necessary, remove pads to access hardware.


Insert the longer metal end of AirFrame TM accessory mount between helmet halves as shown so that the cutout in the mount is aligned with the hole for screw and anchor C.

Be certain to use the correct mount for the appropriate side of your helmet (see picture for reference).

3. With the longer end of the mount inserted between helmet halves, pivot the other side of the mount into position as shown so that the cutout in the shorter metal end of the accessory mount is aligned with the hole for screw and anchor A.



4. Reinsert screw and anchor C as shown and loosely tighten so that the mount is still movable and can be easily repositioned.





5. Place left Rail on exterior side of helmet. Ensure helmet straps are not twisted. Insert anchors A and B into strap ends. Secure Rail and straps to helmet. Loosely tighten screws A and B so that the Rail and strap ends are still movable and can be easily repositioned.





6. Turn helmet over to view exterior side of helmet. Insert left Chop or Ear into mount opening. Ensure that the rear lip of the insert (Chop or Ear) slides in between the Rail and helmet.

7. Adjust position of Rail so that there is as little of a gap as possible between the Chop or Ear and the Rail as shown. This ensures that the Chop or Ear will remain aligned with the edge of the helmet.



8. Turn helmet over to view interior side of helmet. Align edge of Chop or Ear to the inside edge of the helmet as illustrated.





9. Adjust position of mount so that the release tab is centered in mount opening. There should be a small gap between the top edges of the release tab and mount opening as illustrated. This ensures that the Chop or Ear will seat properly when inserted.



10-A. Ensure that the front strap end is parallel to the inside edge of the helmet. Tighten screw and anchor A. Proper torque value of screw/anchor A is 20 in-lb. Non-permanent thread locker may be applied to screw/anchor as necessary.

10-B. Ensure that the rear strap end is parallel to the inside edge of the helmet. Tighten screw and anchor B. Proper torque value of screw/anchor B is 20 in-lb. Non-permanent thread locker may be applied to screw/anchor as necessary.



11. Double check the position of all the components: Rail, Chop/Ear, accessory mount, and helmet strap ends. Tighten screw and anchor C. Proper torque value of screw/anchor C is 6 in-lb. Non-permanent thread locker may be applied to screw/anchor as necessary. Replace impact pads if they were removed in Step 2.

Test accessory mount installation by inserting and releasing Chop or Ear into mount. The accessory should snap into place and securely fit so that it cannot be removed without pressing the release tab. Repeat installation instructions for right side of helmet.
